RESOLUTION NO. 10-2022

A RESOLUTION ADOPTING THE FEDERALLY APPROVED OTTAWA COUNTY MULTIJURISDICTIONAL NATURAL HAZARD MITIGATION PLAN AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, the Village of Marblehead is a municipal entity formed and organized pursuant to the Constitution and laws of the State of Ohio; and

WHEREAS, the Council of the Village of Marblehead recognizes the threat that natural hazards pose to people and property within Ottawa County and Marblehead; and

WHEREAS, Ottawa County has prepared a multi-hazard mitigation plan, hereby known as Ottawa County Multijurisdictional Natural Hazard Mitigation Plan of July 2022, in accordance with the Disaster Mitigation Act of 2000; and

WHEREAS, the Ottawa County Multijurisdictional Natural Hazard Mitigation Plan identifies mitigation goals and actions to reduce or eliminate long-term risk to people and property in Ottawa County from the impacts of future hazards and disasters; and

WHEREAS, ADOPTION BY THE Marblehead Village Council demonstrates their commitment to hazard mitigation and achieving the goals outlined in the Ottawa County Multijurisdictional Natural Hazard Mitigation Plan of July 2022; and

WHEREAS, the Plan has been approved by the Federal Emergency Management Agency;

NOW, THEREFORE, Be It Resolved by the Council of the Village of Marblehead, Ottawa County, Ohio, that:

<u>SECTION 1</u>. The federally approved Ottawa County Multijurisdictional Natural Hazard Mitigation Plan of July 2022 is hereby adopted in accordance with the Disaster Mitigation Act of 2000.

SECTION 2. It is found and determined that all formal actions of the Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this resolution were taken in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were taken in meetings open to the public, in full compliance with applicable legal requirements including §121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

<u>SECTION 3</u>. This Resolution is declared to be an emergency for the immediate preservation of the public's peace, health, safety, and welfare, and for the further reason that natural disasters are prevalent in the current weather season.
